Minutes of the Pulaski Alumni Association 133rd Annual Alumni Banquet, Saturday June 24, 2023

The banquet was opened at 6pm by President Margaret Mathison Weigel, '67. Invocation was given by Pastor Glenn Bosak, Pulaski Wesleyan Church. The first stanza of the Alma Mater was sung, and all were seated for dinner. The buffet meal was prepared by caterer Brandon Nicholas of Parish and consisted of BBQ chicken, baked beans, macaroni salad, tossed salad, rolls & butter and coffee service. Pulaski Student Government and Varsity Club members assisted as servers.

Following the meal, the business meeting was opened by President Margaret Weigel at 7pm. The Pledge of Allegiance to the American flag was led by President Weigel. Over 170 alumni and guests were present.

President Weigel introduced the head table and honored guests. The minutes of the 2022 meeting were included in the annual alumni newsletter and were approved upon motion of Anne Hud Gibbs Miller, and 2nd by Allen Goodsell. All in favor, none opposed, motion carried.

Treasurer Tammie Frank Whaley reviewed the Treasurers report, noting \$14,200 was being given out in scholarships from the Alumni Association for which we should all be proud. In paying these out this year, there was no need to take a distribution from our CNY Community fund investment account. It was noted that due to market conditions the investment account saw a \$20,000 loss overall. The balances forward to date were reported as: Community Bank General Fund: \$8,783.45; Alumni Scholarship: \$10,974.79; Harold Youker Scholarship: \$6,756.83; Lura Sharp Scholarship: \$2,407.53; Wall of Distinction fund: \$1,361 for a total of \$30,283.60 held locally.

In our Central New York Community Fund Accounts the balances were: General Fund Investment Account: \$3,328.92; Alumni Scholarship Account: \$60,392.48; Harold Youker Athletic Scholarship Account: \$25,928.79; Lura Sharp Memorial Scholarship Account: \$51,975.66; John Ben Snow Endowment Fund Account: \$42,297.83 for totals held as of December 31, 2022, at \$183,923.72. Combined assets between CNY Fund and Community Bank total \$214,252.32.

Motion to approve the Treasurers report was made by Charlotte Summerville DeGaetano, 2nd by Ted Williams. All in favor, none opposed, motion carried.


Annual Alumni Bus Tour, June 29, 2024, 10:30 am departure

The Kallet Theater—built in 1939 after the disastrous Temple Theater fire that leveled a two-story building with three storefronts, one of which served as a theater. The Kallet is central to many of our memories of growing up. It closed in February 1984 and was used afterwards as an auto parts store for a long time, with the theater itself nothing more than a large storeroom. Vince Lobdell a former Carrier employee who developed a successful patent for air purification technology and started his own company Heathway, bought the theater in 2011 and committed to restore it for use as a banquet facility, offsite training auditorium for his company as well as Fulton Boiler Works, and since 2014 has hosted many weddings, concerts and also serves as an event center. Renovations changed the main room to feature a level floor which accommodates either banquet tables or chairs to seat nearly 400 people. The large lounge on the second floor has been tastefully redecorated as a bar area, with a new balcony overlooking the ground floor and stage constructed during the renovation. This redevelopment of the theater, though closed for much of COVID, has brought new life, and is once again an anchor to our downtown!



Old Kinney Drugs---Was long in poor condition currently, and under redevelopment Earl's Restaurant and the old Smith Law office have been restored as part of a downtown renovation grant obtained in 2010 which also assisted with work to the theater, and the old hardware store at the foot of the hill. The two partners who renovated the former Earls (now LD's on the River) have created a loft apartment upstairs with spectacular river views. LD's on the River is a popular tavern complex which includes a patio in between.

WEST SIDE DOWNTOWN---

Former Peoples Bank Building-Currently under redevelopment by owner Jeff Fowler through a NYS grant, and soon home to "Life is Good" brand store. The structure was built in 1882 and served as a Masons Lodge until 1892, and later a bank until the depression. American Finance was here in the 1970s.

How many remember the Pulaski Day fire in October 1960 that levelled the Pulaski House/Draco's Restaurant. Oswego County Savings Bank was built on the site in 1967 and expanded in the 1980s with the removal of other buildings to the north. NBT Bank is the new name.

Most of the buildings on the west side of downtown have changed occupants' numerous times. Crystal Jelly, "Flashy Flamingo" (site of the old Byrne Dairy Store) and the "Life is Good" store, are among many of the small new shops that are popping up under new young owners.

Pulaski Historical Society and Half-Shire maintain a "genealogy of downtown" to document what was located where and would love to hear your memories of these storefronts. A tour of the historic district was conducted on June 1, by the Heritage Foundation of Oswego County

Pulaski and Half-Shire Historical Societies work to keep history alive



Returning alumni are encouraged to visit our two vibrant historical societies and their museums.

Membership in the Pulaski Historical Society helps to preserve the history of our village. The museum, located at 3428 Maple Avenue, is on the site of the original John Ben Snow home and was donated to the

Historical Society by the Snow Memorial Trust. We are very fortunate to have this home to store our artifacts and archives and it is our legacy to future generations to maintain the building and its contents. We are also lucky to have the Mary Lou Morrow Carriage House where we can host our programs and other displays.



Pulaski Historical Society has been going through a massive renovation thanks to a gift from the estate of Evelyn B. Davis (Class of 1951). We house business histories, family histories, and village histories. We are fully staffed by volunteers. Monthly newsletters are distributed by mail, email and to a few local places. A Tuesday Teaser is done weekly to encourage knowledge of the village in days gone by.

Half-Shire Historical Society, located in the former Richland School, represents the surrounding eleven towns of northern Oswego County, the Lewis County towns of Montague and Osceola, the Oneida County towns of Florence and Camden. The Society concentrates greatly on genealogical research and assists with Ancestry DNA test interpretations. Half-Shire produces a 12-page quarterly newsletter, the 16-page quarterly *Tug Hill Literary Review*, conducts monthly lunch program meetings in Richland, and annual spring and fall dinner dances that are open to the public.

In 2021 as a result of a generous gift from the late Ambassador H. Douglas Barclay, the former third grade room was renovated and transformed into a model 1926 classroom, as well as a research room dedicated to the history of our schools in Pulaski and surrounding districts. A complete collection of Pulaski School yearbooks, as well as growing collections from APW, Sandy Creek, Camden, Belleville-Henderson, and Mexico Schools. A newly expanded barn and pavilion on the grounds offers an outdoor venue for events, as well as agricultural and logging exhibits.
