Board of Education Meeting Requirement

VERIFICATION FORM

1. All students planning to graduate in June must attend a meeting of the Pulaski school board during the school year.
2. **This is a requirement; failure to attend a meeting means the student will be unable to graduate in June.**
3. Students may choose which of the meetings they wish to attend. However, the school board will meet only once per month this school year. Students only have **10** meetings to choose from.
4. Students are required to **be on time** for the meeting, which begins at 6:30 p.m.
5. Students are not to wear hats at the meeting, nor to eat during the meeting. Students should also dress in a manner befitting a formal public forum.
6. Students are required to **stay for the entire meeting, or until 9:30**, whichever comes first.
7. Students are required to have **signed verification** that they were in attendance. The form may be **signed by**: the middle school or high school principal, the superintendent, or a sitting board member. The form needs to be filled in and returned by the student to his/her teacher at the next class.
8. In addition to the signed form, **students will report on the meeting by completing the questions on the back of this form.** Students need to reflect on the happenings and procedures in a democratically run organization.
