Dear Parents/Guardians:

The school district has been notified that one of our 5th grade students at Lura Sharp Elementary School has tested positive for COVID-19. The district is working closely with the Oswego County Health Department as they conduct contact tracing with individuals who were in close contact with the student on Thursday, November 5th, the last day the student was in attendance at school. Those who have been within close proximity are being contacted directly by the Department of Health and will be placed in mandatory quarantine through Thursday, November 19th.

Because of our classroom cohort model, which keeps students learning together in small contained groups throughout the day, there was no known exposure for any other elementary students. For those students and staff not directly impacted by these quarantine orders, school will remain open and in-person.

Students impacted by quarantine orders will switch to a remote learning model. For tomorrow, these students should complete the activities in the 5th grade emergency plans previously sent home or found on the website [here](#). Chromebooks will be delivered to homes on Thursday. Students should login to google classroom to begin remote instruction on Friday.

Thank you for your understanding as we work through these difficult circumstances. We remain committed to doing all we can to provide for the safety and well-being of the staff, students and families of our school district.
