Dear Parents/Guardians:

We were notified late last night that a member of our Lura Sharp Elementary School community has tested positive for COVID-19. Out of an abundance of caution and in order to allow time to conduct contact tracing, all elementary students will switch to remote learning from home today. Students should complete the activities found in the emergency plans previously sent home which can also found on our website [here](#).

Pulaski Middle-High School, Make Sense Shop, Academic Center, and CITI BOCES programs are not impacted by this and will operate on a normal schedule today.

The district is collaborating with the Oswego County Health Department to conduct contact tracing and identify individuals who were in close contact. Those who have been within close proximity are being contacted directly by the school district this morning. The district will follow up with another mass communication once these notifications are complete.

Students impacted by quarantine orders will switch to remote learning until the end of their quarantine period. For those students and staff not directly impacted by these quarantine orders, school will reopen tomorrow.

Thank you for your understanding as we work through these difficult circumstances. We remain committed to doing all we can to provide for the safety and well-being of the staff, students and families of our school district.
